

## THE CHAIRMAN'S COLUMN





This year is the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Herefordshire and Gloucestershire Canal Society. How things have changed since then! Certainly the folk gathered in the Red Cross Hall in Hereford on April 13th 1983 didn't entertain the idea of restoring the Canal from Gloucester to Hereford. A short length of canal or towpath here and there might be feasible, but restoring all 34 miles was only dreamt of. The main aim was to promote interest in the Canal before it was lost altogether and it seemed that the best way to do this was as members of a society.

Twenty years on, the Society having become the Trust and committed to full restoration, I asked the January meeting of the Council of Management what our priorities for 2003 should be. After some discussion a theme emerged, which, I must confess, I hadn't really expected – it was *membership*.

So why is a strong membership so important; after all we already have a membership of over 1,000? Some of the reasons are obvious. Members are the life-blood of the Trust and if we are going to achieve anything at all, it is our members who will have to do the work. Whilst we will not achieve our objective on our own, we can be quite sure that, unless we make the effort, we cannot expect anyone else to. And then there is money. Our subscription rates are modest, but with a large membership this adds up to a considerable resource.

When it comes to allocating grants, the major funding bodies look for evidence of public support – and a healthy Trust membership is just that. Local bodies are influenced by local opinion and national bodies are influenced by national opinion, so we need not only members from Herefordshire and Gloucestershire, but from Cumbria, Kent and Cornwall too.

Now I know what you're thinking. "Why is he banging on about membership in **The Wharfinger**? – if I'm reading this I'm, probably a member already". Well, for better or worse, I joined the former Society because a member told me about it, and that is why you are important. Enthusiasm is infectious and new members will join us (or not!) as a result of what we "old" members say and do. Let's see how many new members we can welcome this year. There is plenty for them to do and we can offer a lot in return. Over to you!







## THE TRADING COMPANY TICK?

Whereas in past years, the report of Trading Company activities has appeared among the reports presented at Trust AGM, your Trading Company Committee feels that Canal Trust members would appreciate learning about its background activities, which provide the foundation on which we operate.

These activities are ongoing, very often needing us to consider the next year, whilst we are still engaged on the current programme. As well as the venues to which we take our Sales and Information Stands, the Canal Trust Social Programme has to function and planning for next year's **Grand Holiday Draw** to be worked out. The programme of volunteers to staff the venues is also drafted as far as possible, as is



transportation of equipment and goods to and from site. The Sales stock has regularly to be replaced and supplemented, with new products considered, whilst Display Information and Equipment is upgraded on a regular basis. Your Trading Company Committee generally meets once every month, to vet progress, assess improvements and put the final touches to the next venues.

The most important parts of The Trading Company are its people. ### PROGRESS AT OXENHALL

We normally progress slowly at this time of the year due to Christmas and bad weather but we have started laying coping stones on the top of the non towpath wall - so there is something to show for our efforts. All the stone cut in the summer has now been transported to the lock by our faithful tractor and awaits a final dressing and positioning into the lock wall. There are still several large stones remaining in the yard which will be taken to the saw mill and hopefully there will be enough altogether to finish the lock.

Update!

Two of our volunteers, David and Elizabeth are still beavering away on our 'Bailey' bridge and have now painted all the visible bits - just the difficult sections underneath to do; but that means the decking has to be lifted which is another job for the tractor.

Winter is also a time for cutting back excess vegetation along the towpath and Canal banks. One of our dinghies was brought into service to tackle the overhanging branches on the Canal above the lock and great fun it proved to be and a nice job for a cold day with a roaring bonfire made from the branches.

### PROGRESS AT OVER


the last three months has been the quarter of the year without Open Days but I'd like to mention the last Open Day of 2002 in October, I was not able to be there but was very aware of the atrocious weather. The next day I received an email from Maggie Jones which illustrates the determination of our volunteers.

I'll quote in full:- "Despite the storms during the night and continuing through part of Sunday we decided to go ahead with the Open Day. Arrived to find the area having a power cut - (not that that affects us at Over at present). Half the road signs needed to be stood up again. Fences around site were blown over and the 'smart hut' roof torn to shreds. The model boat people came to review the situation and said it was the equivalent to a 600mph gale to their little boats and so phoned around to tell the others not to come.

First job was to contact local Radio to tell them that we were open for business unlike every other event that had cancelled due to the storm. We were rewarded with a cheer on air!"

Some 30 or so brave visitors did venture out and a couple of the local residents, who were still minus power, popped over for a cup of tea!

Glyn, one of our Wednesday helpers at the time and a roofer by trade, was so concerned about the damage to the roof that he offered to fix it. So, using his own equipment and a lot of his own materials, he laid a complete new felt roof on top of the old one which was too badly rotted to patch up. It must be said he made a splendidly professional job of it.



The brickwork of the stilling chamber continues to grow.

The stilling chamber, which will intercept silt on the output from the pumping station, has grown steadily. All of the white brickwork and the pair of arches facing the pump shaft have been completed. Although several more courses of bricks have been added, it may look as if nothing has changed. That's because, while the chamber has grown in height, the land around (which we had to cut back to construct the chamber) has been brought back to towpath level, thus burying the new work. Just a few more courses of brickwork to go and we can top it off with a seat.

A great deal more progress has been made in the car park. About three quarters of the total area had been surfaced by the day of THE WHARF HOUSE handover, so we were able to use the area as a car park for visitors for the first time. The final quarter still needed levelling but the ground was too "gluey" even for "Blue" (the Waterway Recovery Group's tracked mini excavator) to make a decent job of it. Then, in early February, a few dry days gave ideal conditions and the opportunity was taken to level off the next section. The Wednesday Gang then laid more Terram geotextile and spread road planings over the newly levelled area so that 35 of the planned 37 parking spaces should be completed by the end of February.

We have found the most effective way to retain the soil at the rear of each parking bay is with a dry-stone wall. However, we rapidly ran out of Cotswold stone. We then realised that our colleagues at Oxenhall had the solution to our problem. They had a lot of surplus stone that is not large enough for their work on the lock and was destined to be sold off as rockery stone. Using the Waterways Museum's lorry we have collected about seven loads so the wall-building has sped along as a result. It's an interesting point to realise that this reclaimed stone from the Roman Road bridge in Hereford (rebuilt in 1995) is being used to complete this walling job at Over.

We held our third annual volunteers Skittles evening, this time at the King's Arms at Newent. The change of venue was to ensure a more central location which successfully resulted in attendance by volunteers from Over, Oxenhall and Hereford. After two years of male dominance, Joan Jones took the prize for champion skittler.

During the evening our Member Roy Jamieson was presented with a cake, a framed print of himself steering Mister Maysey, (our trip boat at Over), and card to congratulate him on his retirement. Roy worked for British Waterways for many years and more recently, as Archivist for The Waterways Trust based in Gloucester Docks. The card had been carefully chosen because it showed the Grand Union Canal at Stoke Bruerne where Roy once worked. What we did not know was that the picture included the actual house that Roy used to live in!

We have been tidying up some of the woodland areas, felling trees which had either died or been damaged by the wind. Much of this was done by hand by our Duke of Edinburgh Awards team. Working in teams of two, with one bow

saw to each pair, they worked very effectively. They also keep increasing in number so that we now have a team of eleven working on various levels of award.

At the same time we have been tree planting, replacing a silver birch on the Canal bank near the gabions, and planting in the car park a splendid potted chestnut that came to us as a donation. Several trees have been moved out of the nursery, making way for others. Most recently, several poplars have been planted in the nature reserve and we've started clearing undergrowth and ivy on the woodland bank of the Canal.

Early Spring will have seen all the management work in the woodland completed. We will then be able to replant with a variety of native species to create a visually and environmentally interesting small patch of woodland adjacent to the Canal. This also acts as an important screen to reduce the visual impact of the residential development on the Leadon Valley.

Any volunteers who wish to join us on either Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Saturdays or Sundays would be very welcome and should contact the people listed below. Work will be continuing outside throughout the Summer to maintain and enhance the site as well as some small building projects. Of course there will also be the huge task of fitting out THE WHARF HOUSE.

The installation of the two pairs of sponsored benches on the Wharf wall has been completed.

### RIVER CANAL RESCUE

We also have an 'in house' engineer, who can be called upon to deal with difficult situations, or help the customer to run through fault finding tests. 

On 3rd January THE WHARF HOUSE Company was born. It is set up just like the Trust's existing Trading Company and will Gift Aid its profits to support Canal restoration maintenance. It will have a 15 year lease on THE WHARF HOUSE to complete the fit out, establish, run and maintain the business and site.

The voluntary Directors are listed in the completely reworked inside front cover of The Wharfinger, and like The Trading Company we report back to the Canal Trust Council of Management. THE WHARF HOUSE COMPANY (TWHCO) is now applying for VAT registration, which will not effect the rest of the Trust, and Liz Connors acts as Treasurer for the whole of the Canal Trust group of companies.

Apart from being a requirement of the Charity Commission that the Trust does not 'trade', and so requiring the day to day operation of TWHco to be split off from the Trust, it ensures that this group remains focussed on the business. Very importantly it also financially separates TWHco from the Trust, and ensures that the only security that is used for any loans for TWHco is the lease and not the building itself, protecting the long term asset for the Trust.

On site, the last few weeks have seen the major task of the insulation and boarding in of the roof completed, and the connection of electricity and telephone services. The amount of behind the scenes work to just get services connected is phenomenal, and poor Wilf looks set to be bald by the time we open for business!! Unfortunately this massive amount of behind the scenes work is replicated for every aspect of the fit out.


Alongside you will see the final (probably a silly word to use!) layout for the top floor, showing the office, staff room, residents lounge, and the two prime letting bedrooms. To maximise use of space the wardrobes etc in the bedrooms are set between the verticals of the rafters out in the eaves as are the filing cabinets etc in the office. Every square inch that can be used is, and it is amazing how much storage you need space that is at a premium.


By the time you read this the top floor layout will have received its final Building Regulation approval and work on constructing the internal walls on the top floor will have commenced. You may ask why we are starting at the top? Well it does actually make sense in construction terms to take this floor as far as we can as quickly as we can. We also cannot start on the ground floor until the screed is in, and this has got a bit delayed for reasons beyond our control. However, by the first Open Day (in April) you should be able to see very major progress on both the top and ground floors - so please come along if you can for the guided tour around THE WHARF HOUSE at 12.30. There is only one tour at lunch time each open day so as not to interrupt work to meet the tight deadlines.

## Distribution of Wharfinger

### AYLESTONE PARK CANAL PROJECT

t last there is action to be seen on restoring the Canal in Hereford! There has been a lot of talking going on over the years and we even have three new bridges but no sign of anything looking like a Canal. The Canal Corridor is promoted in the draft Unitary Development Plan for Hereford and the benefits of a restored Canal are now being far more widely recognised.

This is about the only section of the Canal in Hereford City, which is still recognisable as such, and it actually

> holds water at about the original depth of 4ft. Unfortunately there is about 4ft of accumulated silt as well which makes rather a squidgy mess and is certainly not for walking on - 2 inadvertent attempts have been made so far and the culprits had to be pulled out and taken home for a change of clothing! A small dinghy was initially used to gain access to the far bank but a bridge of pallets has now been constructed and seems to "float" quite well on the mud.

> The old white mobile dental surgery which has become a site hut and has done service at Over is now parked adjacent to the Canal and looks very smart having been given a makeover and a new yellow stripe around the middle - a bit like a

cheese sandwich! It has already proved its worth because, true to tradition, it always seems to rain or snow on Saturdays.

The start of "jungle bashing" on a 300yard stretch was reported last time and work has been progressing steadily so that the towpath is now accessible. Numerous bonfires have been built to dispose of the bramble, hawthorn, holly and even privet and many of the larger branches (mostly willow) have been taken for home fires although they tell me it doesn't burn very well. We do have some hawthorn and other timber which it is hoped to add to the pile offered for sale in the last edition. A start has now been made on the more difficult task of dragging out the trees growing in the bed of the canal which is where the skill of not falling

in the mud is required. Alan Flexman, who is now learning it, is one of our new recruits and he comes with a tractor which is very handy for this sort of work. We have had several new recruits and hopefully more will join us as the year continues. Vegetation clearance has to finish before the nesting season starts in March so that is our deadline. We are hoping to keep the new team of volunteers together and move on to other jobs after then but more on that next time.





## The Herefordshire and Gloucestershire Canal

Work started in 1792 but was not completed until 1845, making this the last major route built in Britain, but for the navigations of Birmingham and the Manchester Ship Canal. The canal stretched for 34 miles from the River Severn at Gloucester, via Newent, Dymock and Ledbury to the city of Hereford, utilising some 22 locks and 3 tunnels. the Canal was formally closed in 1881 to allow construction of the Ledbury to Gloucester railway which in its turn was closed by Dr Beeching in 1964.

The Canal Society was formed in 1983 and replaced in 1992 by Herefordshire and Gloucestershire Canal Trust, a registered charity. The Trust has an ordinary and corporate membership exceeding 1,100 from all over the country and abroad! Our objective is to fully restore the 34 mile Canal, from its connection with the 2,500 mile inland waterway network at Gloucester to the centre of Hereford. A Steering Committee of Local Authorities, etc. has been formed by the Trust to assist in progressing this objective. We have a major restoration site in each county. which together extend to some 3.5 miles.
